

## A PENSION PRIMER

## 

Editor's note: At at recent Board meeting, Legislative Chair, Ed Andersen, spoke about the Republican challenges to the Minnesota TRA pension laws expected during the next Legislative session. Since pension issues are of great importance to our members, and since members may need to contact their legislators in support of our pension system, the Board requested that Ed provide sone basic information about our pension structure and the role of the Committee of Thirteen in advocating for us. The Committee of Thirteen is one of the Minneapolis civic organizations to which MRTI makes an annual financial contribution.

All active and retired Minneapolis licensed teachers and administrators are members of the State of Minnesota Teacher Retirement Association (TRA), which administers our pension plan.

Your pension is controlled by the pension law in effect the day you sign your first contract to teach; this date determines your normal retirement age. The pension law in effect on your retirement date determines the monthly amount of your pension from TRA. To date, the courts have upheld these pension benefits, shielding them from efforts to cut them by legislative action. The annual Cost of Living Adjustments (COLA) and contribution rates of teachers and employers are determined by legislative action and can, and do, change. Our COLAs from TRA are closely connected to the Life Expectancy of Minnesota teachers and to the Rate of Return on our assets controlled by the Minnesota State Board of Investment.

The 2015 Experience Study conducted by TRA showed that the Life Expectancy of Minnesota teachers has increased by almost two years and the expected rate of return on our TRA assets has decreased somewhat. These facts compel the Committee of 13 to recommend legislative changes to preserve the financial stability of our TRA pension system. These changes include a reduction in the 2% COLA and an increase in state contribution rates for active teachers.

The Minneapolis Committee of Thirteen (C-13) is a Political Action Committee (PAC) operating under the laws of the State of Minnesota. It represents active and retired Minneapolis teachers and administrators at the Minnesota Legislature and Minneapolis School Board. The Committee of Thirteen Board consists of 13 appointed members: the Minneapolis Federation of Teachers (MFT) appoints 6 active teachers: Minneapolis Retired Teachers Incorporated (MRTI) appoints 4 members; Retired Teacher Chapter of Local 59 (RTC-59) appoints 2 members and the Minneapolis Principals Forum appoints 1 member. Representatives of the Minneapolis Committee of Thirteen will participate in the meetings of the Minnesota Senate-House Joint Legislative Committee on Pensions and Retirement (LCPR).

The Committee solicits funds from active and retired Minneapolis teachers and administrators to conduct its political action. The Committee of Thirteen hires a lobbyist (Louise Sundin) to represent it at the Minnesota Legislature. During election periods, the Committee reviews, endorses and supports candidates for office with campaign contributions, door knocking, literature drops and phone campaigns to get out the vote. The Committee may ask all active and retired Minneapolis teachers to contact their legislators to support its proposals.

The Committee of Thirteen meets the 4th Tuesday of the month from 4:30-6:30 at the MFT Office, 67 Eighth Avenue NE, Minneapolis, MN 55413. Currently, the Committee needs more active-teacher members. MRTI members are requested to encourage actively-teaching friends to consider serving on the Committee of Thirteen.

## CONSIDER MRTI

Are you a member of MPR or TPT? Have they, or your Alma Mater, suggested that you include them in your Will or estate plan? This not-too-subtle reminder that we can't take it with us seems to appear more frequently in fundraising appeals, and it's not a surprise to discover why.

The October 19, 2015 issue of the blog DQYDJ.net states that, "the retiree set is the wealthiest demographic in America... More than 60% of households headed by 65+ year old members have at least sixfigures of wealth, and more than 10 percent are into the seven figures." Admittedly, a large portion of this wealth is tied up in real estate, (our homes). But, as we begin to downsize our homes and possessions we are reaping the benefit of the rising real estate markets. Even homes which lost significant value during the recession have largely recovered and, if you've owned your home for many years, the amount for which you can now sell it is probably double or triple the amount that you paid for it, or more.

Even after budgeting for new housing, support for our health and old-age issues and setting aside college funds for our grandchildren, the average retirees, 65 or older, will still have a sizeable chuck of discretionary funds available. Colleges, Universities and non-profits like MPR and the ASPCA have all recognized that retirees are a source of enormous potential for fund-raising and that "legacy giving" allows the donor to plan for the gift to be given when he or she has passed on and is no longer in need of the money!

MRTI has been the recipient of several such bequests over the years and the moneys we have received, carefully invested by our Investment Committee, help to fund the charitable and philanthropic activities we take on each year – from donations to Mary's Place and Achieve MPLS, to the classroom grant program we began last year. So....

When you're thinking about the donations which you want to include in your will or estate plan, think about adding MRTI to the list. It's a great way to insure that future Minneapolis Public Schools' teachers and students continue to get the support they need to teach and learn in the environment of tomorrow.


