

On November 2 about 90 MRTI members gathered at the Eagles Club to hear from Leslee Gold, of Minnesota Medicare Consultants.


This was an enlightening seminar, providing information about pending changes to Medicare Supplemental Insurance offerings. Leslee reviewed and clarified much of the language surrounding Medicare, the kinds of insurance available to Minnesotans in the past and what to expect in the future. The goal was to help attendees become better informed



when making their decisions about what supplemental insurance would be right for them as individuals for 2018 - 2019.


